As we move closer and closer to the 500th anniversary of the Reformation we do well to remember some of the things that the reformers fought so valiantly to preserve and defend. A central teaching in Scripture involves the doctrine of justification – that *we are saved by grace through faith in Jesus Christ!* This doctrine alone defeats the errors and false doctrines that threaten to creep into the Church regarding salvation. Article IV of the Augsburg Confessions declares,

ARTICLE IV - Justification

Our churches teach that people cannot be justified before God by their own strength, merits, or works. People are freely justified for Christ's sake, through faith, when they believe that they are received into favor and that their sins are forgiven for Christ's sake. By His death, Christ made satisfaction for our sins. God counts this faith for righteousness in His sight (Romans 3:21–26; 4:5).

God has reconciled the whole world unto Himself through the vicarious life and death of His Son and has commanded that the reconciliation effected by Christ be proclaimed to the ends of the earth; therefore faith in Christ is the only way for men to obtain personal reconciliation with God, that is, forgiveness of sins (Acts 10:43; John 3:16-18, 36). Through faith in Christ, we obtain the forgiveness of sins, but this is not as a result of any human effort to fulfill the Law of God. Through the gift of faith we have been given in Baptism, we receive the forgiveness of sins, or justification, which was earned for us by Christ.

ARTICLE V - The Ministry

So that we may obtain this faith, the ministry of teaching the Gospel and administering the Sacraments was instituted. Through the Word and Sacraments, as through instruments, the Holy Spirit is given (John 20:22). He works faith, when and where it pleases God (John 3:8), in those who hear the Good News that God justifies those who believe that they are received into grace for Christ's sake. This happens not through our own merits, but for Christ's sake. Our churches condemn [those]...who think that through their own preparations and works the Holy Spirit comes to them without the external Word.¹

Thanks be to God our Lord continues to shower us with His love and mercy and sustains us by His Word and Sacraments. Christ alone delivers the fullness of the salvation that He won for us by His grace, so let us humbly, penitently, and prayerfully look to Him in true faith as we live out our lives according to the callings and vocation He has given us. God's blessings!



He is the redeemer of the world. He is the one who has conquered sin, death, and the power of the devil by His death, resurrection, and ascension.

Just as we are richly blessed, we are also thereby freed to be a blessing. Since God has endowed us with His gifts, we are set to endow others. Thus, we give of the blessings we have received so that others may be blessed. We do this in our homes, our communities, and our churches. We press the blessings God has lavished upon us in service to those around us. We use our time, our talents, and our treasures to be a blessing even as they have been a blessing to us.

The Lord blesses us. And He enlists us to be a blessing to others. So, whenever you put that envelope in the collection plate, when you set out to serve at the local food pantry, when you sit down to help your kids with homework, think of this: The Lord has blessed you, so that you will be a blessing.


